ELMC is one way to fulfill your cross-cultural requirement, and you can also receive academic credit by registering for it as a fall elective and completing a few written assignments after the intensive portion in August. The registration fee through The Episcopal Church is \$800 for seminarians, and it includes lodging and meals in Atlanta, as well as some meals in Sewanee. In the past, many students have received financial support from their dioceses and/or sponsoring parishes.
